The Facilities

With construction steaming ahead and the community eagerly anticipating the completion of our redevelopment, the Town would like to update the community on the many benefits and facilities our oval precinct will deliver:

- first class sporting facilities for lawn bowls, croquet and football
- a café for the community to enjoy
- a landscaped recreational area that promotes passive recreational activities
- a large, enclosed off-lead dog exercise area
- an all-abilities outdoor playground
- · a health club

- an outdoor basketball ½ court
- a skate zone
- · a focus on sustainability
- upgraded playgroup facilities at Sumpton Green, and
- new and improved community facilities including a function centre and meeting rooms.

Cost escalations are real in this high inflationary environment, however Council is committed to providing a community precinct and will ensure that whilst the scope has been altered, the project will be delivered on budget and on time.

Construction works* in the precinct continue at pace. The slab for the first floor has been poured and the roof and grandstand have been installed. Externally, the southern bank is being excavated for the skate zone

and basketball half court and the oval playing surface will be planted in September. The precinct is on schedule for a planned finish in March 2024 and an anticipated opening in May 2024.

The Facility Operator Business Plan

The Facility Operator Business Plan, which has been prepared to satisfy the requirements of the Local Government Act 1995, was advertised for a period of six (6) weeks and Council will consider any submissions made. The Business Plan outlines:

- proposed services and future management arrangements for the precinct
- financial details of the payments being made by the Town to the Operator under the Operator Agreement and Lease (including funding any operating deficits)
- adherence to the Town's Community Plan, and
- information on the Town's ability to manage the project.
