Urban Streetscape and Public Realm Style Guide

The Town of East Fremantle's eclectic streetscape will be protected and given direction into the future with its new draft Urban Streetscape and Public Realm Style Guide that will direct local government, developers, project managers, designers, community groups and residents engaged in the use, design, implementation and ongoing management and maintenance of public spaces according to best practice principles and local values. The multi-faceted approach that includes pamphlets for the distinct precincts within the Town covers such aspects

as footpath and crossover materials, tree selection, verges, public furniture and more.

Public submissions are welcome between now and close of business on Friday 4 December 2020.

East Fremantle Oval Update

Solid progress is being made on refining the vision for the redevelopment of East Fremantle Oval. During September a series of workshops were held with the Working Group and with the community more broadly, to ensure that the designs meet with community needs and aspirations. The feedback so far has been overwhelmingly positive and constructive – thank you to everyone who took the time to participate. Now the multidisciplinary design team will work to refine the design into a highly detailed plan for a final reveal in the coming months. Once agreed, the design will be used as a basis for an advocacy campaign with State and Federal Government partners and private donors to build the facility. Stay tuned for updates as they emerge.

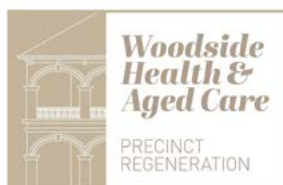

Reconciliation and Climate Change Working Groups Underway

The Town of East Fremantle hosted two meetings of its new Reconciliation Action Plan Working Group in October. The group discussed the scope of the Town's approach to reconciliation and some practical steps that can be made to recognise the Town's ancient and contemporary history as well as Noongar stories, language, culture and imagery, with consideration given to including Noongar community members in the Town's recruitment and procurement. Council looks forward to seeing the Action Plan produced by this Working Group, facilitated by Tim Muirhead and Danny Ford of Kamarang Services, and implementing its recommendations. The Town commends the participants for the open and sincere spirit shown by all participants in this dialogue process.

The Town's new Climate Action Reference Group (CARG) is currently assisting the Town in the construction of a Climate Emergency Strategy which will include visions and high-level goals to set the direction for how Council responds to the climate emergency. The group includes Cr Tony Natale (Chair), Cr Cliff Collinson, Rebecca James, Fraser Maywood, Duanne Ginger, Paul van der Beeke, Christine Finlay, Leigh Nicholas, Wendy Wisniewski, Miles Dracup and Maureen Flynn. The Town is pleased to be receiving guidance from subject matter experts as well as valued community members and thanks everyone who has made a contribution so far.
