# From the Mayor



I am pleased to present the 2021/22 Budget which delivers on the vision confirmed during the review of our Strategic Community Plan for "an inclusive community balancing sustainable growth and lifestyle."

This year, Council has cast the Budget as our local community has emerged quite strongly from last year. Hopefully this will continue and I thank everyone for the contribution you have made to look after your neighbours and friends during this time.

Council has set aside a \$6 million allocation (\$5m in loans, \$1m in own source funding) over several years to fund the redevelopment of East Fremantle Oval. These funds will combine with the \$20 million promised by the State Government. We thank Lisa O'Malley for her continued support of our Town.

As the plan progresses, local businesses will get every opportunity to contribute to the new facilities, and we will plant many new trees and make the new buildings as energy-neutral as possible.

Major renewal works will go ahead this year with our footpaths, and upgrades to drainage. Our plans for reconciliation and action on climate change will progress to deliver real change in these areas that we know are important to all of us.

Last year, we froze salaries and rate increases in response to the pandemic. This Budget will keep rates affordable while providing services, which - our recent biennial survey have revealed - are high quality and valued by you. Our staff are committed to helping everyone in our Town to ensure the best possible services and infrastructure with a focus on addressing climate change. I thank residents for their contribution, staff, CEO and my fellow elected members for their hard work.
