








Bin Collection Map

FOGO and General Waste

FOGO and Recycling

- Ensure bins are placed out by 6.00am on collection day
- Your Food Organics, Garden Organics (FOGO) bin is collected weekly
- Your Recycling and General Waste bins are collected on alternate fortnights
- Do not overfill your bins and ensure lids are firmly closed so items do not spill out

Let's go FOGO

The 3-bin Food Organics, Garden Organics (FOGO) system will provide you with more options for separating your household waste, with the aim of improving recovery rates, increasing diversion from landfill and reducing costs of processing material.

By collecting all your nutrient-rich food waste alongside garden waste in your new lime green lidded FOGO bin, we can generate a high-quality compost to use on farms, parks and gardens and avoid organic waste going to landfill, which produces harmful methane gas.

Even if you don't have a lot of food or garden waste, residents are encouraged to use your FOGO bin to ensure we can recover as much organic waste as possible. You can use your FOGO bin for things you can't put in your home compost bin, like bones, meat and seafood!

Which Bin Do I Put It In?

Place the following items into your kitchen caddy:



Fruit and vegetables





Meat, bones and seafood





Please do not use plastic bags as this will contaminate your FOGO bin

Once the caddy is full, remove the liner and place into your **FOGO** bin

Line your kitchen caddy with Town supplied compostable liners

Collected Weekly



Your **FOGO Bin** is for **F**ood **O**rganics and **G**arden **O**rganics only, including:

- ✓ Fruit and vegetables
- ✓ Meat, bones and seafood
- ✓ Bread and dairy products
- Used paper towel, napkins and tissues

If it didn't live or grow, it isn't FOGO



Collected Fortnightly



Your **Recycling Bin** is for:

- Plastic bottles and containers
- ✓ Glass bottles and jars
- ✓ Steel and aluminium cans
- ✓ Paper and cardboard
- X NO aerosols
- X NO hazardous items
- NO meat trays
- × NO nappies
- NO recycling in bags
- **✗** NO soft plastics



Ensure all recyclables are clean, dry and empty with lids removed

Collected Fortnightly



Your **General Waste Bin** is for all general rubbish items, such as:

- Nappies and hygiene products
- Soft plastics and packaging (can be taken to Redcycle)
- ✓ Polystyrene
- X NO food organics or garden organics
- × NO hazardous items
- X NO clean recycling

Some items shouldn't be placed into any bins and can be harmful and dangerous. For more information about what to do with those materials, refer to the drop off and disposal information page on this calendar or visit **recycleright.wa.gov.au**

Important information for Verge Collections

GREEN WASTE COLLECTIONS

The following Items WILL be collected:

Tree and shrub prunings up to

- ✓ 1.5 metres in length
- ✓ 300mm in diameter
- Two trailer loads (6x4 trailer size) or 2 cubic metres of green waste

The following Items WILL NOT be collected:

- NO bags or boxes of leaves, loose leaves or grass clippings
- NO dug out lawn NO sand and soil materials
- NO general rubbish, bulk or white goods
- NO weeds and root materials

BULK & WHITE GOODS / METAL COLLECTIONS

The following Items WILL be collected:

- ✓ General bulk waste
- Scrap (furniture & other household items)
- Timber products (up to 1.5 metres in length)
- ✓ White goods (fridges, stoves etc, up to 1.5 metres in length)

The following Items WILL NOT be collected:

- × NO asbestos products
- X NO batteries
- X NO bricks, sand or building rubble

- × NO car bodies or vehicle parts
- × NO cement or concrete
- × NO dug out lawn
- X NO food stuff or domestic rubbish
- × NO gas cylinders
- NO green waste, no bags with leaves
- × NO paints, chemicals, oils
- X NO plate glass or shower screens
- × NO stumps or palm logs
- X NO trees
- × NO tyres

Details on how to present verge waste:

- Place away from walls, fences and power poles
- Separate white goods, steel and e-waste from other verge collection goods
- ✓ Keep checking your pile to ensure compliance
- X Do not place under trees or over sprinklers
- X Do not place any items on vacant land or in any park land
- X Do not place on footpaths and driveways
- X Do not follow your neighbour; CHECK DATES first
- X Non-Compliance will result in NO COLLECTION.

 Please place your waste on the verge by 6am Monday on the scheduled start date as the contractor will only service your verge for Green Waste or Bulk/Whitegoods once.





Fremantle Recycling Centre

The Recycling Centre is located on Montreal Street in Fremantle, opposite the golf course. It is open Friday 12 noon – 4pm, Saturday and Sunday 8am – 4pm, excluding public holidays.

The recycling centre is free to all Town of East Fremantle residents – to access the facility please bring photo ID showing your residential address (e.g. driver's licence) with your rates notice or a bill. To drop off unrecyclable Bulky Waste, remember your voucher letter.

The recycling centre accepts:

- ✓ Cardboard
- Clean and unbroken blocks, bricks and pavers
- Electronic waste and mobile phones
- ✓ Fluorescent bulbs and tubes
- Furniture and other bulky household items
- Gas hottles
- Good quality clothing for charity
- Mattresses and bases (\$30 charge per item)
- Motor oil

- One trailer load (6 x 4 trailer size) of clean green waste including shrub and tree prunings up to 1.5mm in length and 30cm in diameter
- ✓ Polvstvrene
- ✓ Printer cartridges
- Recycling the same materials that go in your yellow-topped bin
- Scrap metal
- Tyres (\$18 each)
- ✓ Up to 100L of paint
- ✓ Whitegoods

The recycling centre does not accept:

X Aerosols

- X Asbestos
- X Mixed general waste, bags or boxes of rubbish
- Poisons or chemicals
- X Sand, soil, concrete or rocks

Wood off-cuts or timber

Charges may apply for non-recyclable items.

If you are a Town of East Fremantle resident aged 55 years or over, or with mobility issues, you may be eligible for a free home collection of bulk waste such as mattresses, electrical waste and whitegoods. For more information or to book a collection, call the Town of East Fremantle on 9339 9339.

ASBESTOS, CONSTRUCTION & DEMOLITION (C&D) & HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW):

Asbestos and Construction and Demolition waste can be disposed of for a fee at the following disposal sites:

City of Cockburn – Henderson Waste Recovery Park 920 Rockingham Road, Henderson – 9411 3444

City of Rockingham - Millar Road Landfill

Millar Road West - 9528 8550

These sites also accept domestic quantities of Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) – no more than 20kg/l.
